

● Session Three:

Students prepare for the 7th Grade Career Fair by reviewing logistics of the event day and getting ready to make a good first impression when interacting with company representatives.

Students Will:

- Learn the logistics and the do's and don'ts of attending the in-person event
- Learn the importance of networking and create an elevator pitch to help them network at the event.
- Prepare questions that they want to ask and practice asking them.
- Express their expectations of the upcoming event.

Preparation and Materials

Review the session and the Student Workbook provided by JA.

● Session 4:

Students now reflect on what they have learned and identify next steps to further define their academic choices and career path.

Students Will:

- Evaluate personal goals and priorities based on their experiences at the Career Fair.
- Identify next steps, including exploration of high school coursework and other research.
